

## 2020-21 Annual Report 2022 Budget Proposal

Hello Church and Happy New Year,

It has been some time since we have been able to brief you on our financial activities. We make every effort to use your tithes and donations in a manner that will please God and will allow us to maximize what we get out of every dollar. Here are a few of the behind-the-scenes projects that we have addressed over the last few years.

We hired an electrical contractor to install LED lights on the exterior of the church building. The new lights provide better lighting and use less power. With this change we were able to remove the pole mounted light in the front parking lot. Removing the pole helps with snow removal and Eversource, the owners of the pole and light, were charging us \$70.00 a month as a rental fee. I'm confident that we can find a better use for the \$70.00. The cost of that upgrade was about \$4500.00. While the electricians were here, we also had them add two circuits to the stage to accommodate the electric instruments and eliminate the use of multiple extension cords (a fire code issue).

We have also upgraded the lighting in our parking lot. Our parking lot lights have also been upgraded to LED lights The total cost of the project was around \$14,000.00. However, by taking advantage of a rebate program offered by Eversource we were able to reduce the out-of-pocket cost to the church to \$3800.00. At that price we estimate the return on that investment will be about 2 years.

Our mortgage is one of our largest expenses. We have an adjustable-rate mortgage that is "adjusted" every 7 years. Back in 2013 our interest rate was over 6% and we also had a "floor" in our mortgage agreement that would not allow us to get an interest rate below 6%. In 2013 our monthly mortgage payment was \$5755.69. Approximately \$1300.00 per month went towards the principal and \$4400.00 in interest payments. In 2017 our mortgage was due to be adjusted. In working with our bank, we were able to get the 6% floor removed from the contract. This allowed us to lower our interest rate to 5.375 and brought our payment down to \$5557.11. Now Approximately \$1700.00 was going towards the principal and \$3800.00 towards the interest payment.

In 2020 there was a substantial decrease in the interest rates. We contacted our bank to see if we could take advantage of the lower rates even though we were not due for another rate adjustment until 2025. Although it took several months of negotiation, we were able to get our rate lowered to 4.375. Our monthly payments are now \$5125.26. Approximately \$2300 toward the principal and \$2800 in interest. We have been able to drop our interest payments from \$150.00 a day to \$90.00 a day.

Hopefully we have been able to show you that we are make every effort to be good stewards of God's money. Our goal is to continue to use your tithes and offerings as God would have us use them.

On the outreach and discipleship side of things, we have two new Bible Life Circles and are ready to train others to step into leadership roles. Our eKIDS has taken on a Bible Life Circle approach have small groups learning together about how the Bible applies to their young lives. Our Emmanuel Students team is back to bi-weekly meetings also adopting the Bible Life Circle approach, leading teens to an authentic faith along with a time to let their hair down with activities. Our food pantry was revived and is regularly feeding families every month along with Thanksgiving and Christmas meals. We have maintained a wonderful relationship with Shaw's in Hooksett who helps us with those special days. Our Be Blessed Weekend was fantastic. Visitors joining us and newer folks stepping up made it a special blessing to me as your pastor. Trunk or Treat drew near 1,000 people through our well thought out set up and we were able to bring prayer to those were in need, showing the love of Jesus and inviting many to church. Our Christmas Season was kicked of with an amazing float and team of walkers who passed out nearly 2000 bags with candy and invitations to church. The Community Christmas Tree Lighting drew a crowd, again some new guests. Finally the Compellers killed it this year once again with a much larger crowd than we have seen in years. Giving an authentic demonstration of how it hard it can be to see God through life's trials but in the end realizing He is there along.
